The Jewish Federation of Cincinnati



NEW ADDED BENEFITS FOR ONESOURCE CENTER MEMBERS

We've always had wonderful benefits for nonprofit agencies who want to shop in our Common Good Furniture Bank or Marketplace (formerly Shoppers Club). Now, we've expanded our member benefits even more for nonprofit agencies to get more bang for their buck.

New member benefits include:

 Immediate \$25 credit to use for shopping or a monthly training session

- Free vouchers available for nonprofits to give out to individuals they serve to use in the Common Good Store
- New OneSource Center members receive a free membership for the current calendar year when OneSource is hired for a consulting project
- Discounts on select services, "Special Offerings" access, free nonprofit check-ups and more

A nominal, annual fee can give agencies access to OneSource Center membership benefits. Membership year is January 1–December 31 and renewed annually in January. Tax–exempt organizations including public and private schools, government bodies and religious institutions are eligible.

ONESOURCE CENTER'S COMMON GOOD VOUCHER PROGRAM

OneSource Center has been offering free vouchers to participating agencies to share with clients for two years now. Vouchers are distributed in \$25 increments and can be used for furniture, personal care products, kitchen equipment, household linens, toys for kids and more through the OneSource Center Common Good Store. Agency clients are able to stretch their dollars and receive more needed items through this offering, which raised an additional \$5,000 at the Celebration of Partners event this year.

Partnerships & Connections: Helping in Our Community

With your generous support and contributions, we are able to continue impacting the lives of those that need it most in our community. OneSource Center continues to be the resource hub for local nonprofits, working as a community connector to more than 350 Greater Cincinnati nonprofit organizations. Through these combined efforts, we are able to continue programs such as the two listed below.

TOYS FOR TOTS – ONESOURCE CENTER'S LARGEST DISTRIBUTION TO DATE

Smiles and joy abounded as OneSource Center teamed up with Good360 and Toys for Tots Marines Foundation for a second year to give toys to local children at five regional events. During the Christmas in July event, we welcomed hundreds of parents and children from all over the Tri-state area to our headquarters to pick out toys, which was held in conjunction with the celebration of the opening of our Furniture Bank to the public for the first time. Four additional "Unplug and Play" Toys for Tots distributions were also coordinated with BDK and the Reds Community Fund. Thousands of toys were distributed and hundreds of people came to the events throughout the Greater Cincinnati area.



2022 LINCOLN HEIGHTS COMMUNITY MAKEOVER

Another year and another local neighborhood helped. In August, OneSource Center once again partnered with the **Reds Community Fund**, **Cincinnati Children's**

Hospital, the Cincinnati Zoo, Procter & Gamble, The Cincinnati Toolbank and others to give back through the Reds Community Makeover. Staff helped source furniture from our Common Good Furniture Bank and Marketplace for four separate buildings in Lincoln Heights, including the elementary school, Municipal Building, Adult Learning Center and St. Monica's. A Toys for Tots distribution also took place at the event.
