The 2021 Social Impact Fund is awarding a \$48,000 grant and 100 pro bono hours to local 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations that are improving lives and communities through their work in one of three focus areas: children's health & wellness, financial insecurity, and youth technology initiatives. Letters of Intent due Jan. 20, 2021.

The Daniel and Susan Pfau Foundation grant is awarding grants in the area of education, health, cultural experience, and social welfare of disabled and disadvantaged children, adolescents, young adults (to age 30), and their families. A secondary focus is on disadvantaged children, adolescents, young adults (to age 30), and their families, with a special interest in programs that help clients realize their full potential. Letter of intent is due Jan. 15, 2021.

The next **Sisters of Charity Ministry Foundation grant** cycle will begin accepting Grant Pre-Applications on Jan. 19, 2021 through Jan. 28, 2021, for grants that would provide funding for programs that begin in July 2021. This is the first step in the grant application process.

Duke Energy Foundation's Powerful Communities Grant K-12 supports local communities with over \$30 million in charitable grants each year. Multiple grant applications are available. The "Powerful Communities: K-12 Education*" grant is due Jan. 31, 2021.

PNC- Charitable Trust applications: Numerous Trusts. Deadline Feb. 1 for these trusts that are managed through PNC: The Josephine Schell Russell Charitable Trust, Helen CoardCharitable Trust, Robert H. Reakirt Foundation, John Schroth Family CharitableTrust and the Jack J. Smith Trust.

Andrew Jergens Foundation grant. The Foundation's prime interest is the health, education, cultural experiences and social welfare of children in the Greater Cincinnati area. Deadline for submission is Feb. 15, 2021.

The **Spirit of Construction Foundation** supports outreach initiatives that seek to engage young people in construction careers. Over the past 5 years (in addition to scholarship funding), the SOC Foundation has contributed over \$760,000 towards outreach and \$1.2 million since its founding. The initiatives have a construction component to them and are geared for the most part towards middle school and high school youth. Deadline Feb. 15, 2021.

Free PPE Available to Nonprofits



As a collaborating partner, Cincinnati ToolBank is sharing free masks and hand sanitizer for nonprofit distribution at OneSource Center's location in addition to distribution from their offices. PPE items available include hand sanitizer (12.2 fluid ounce bottles) and disposable surgical masks.

Free PPE supplies are available through two locations:

- OneSource Center Shoppers Club members can pick up free items at the 936
 Dalton Avenue location. (Items are available to all nonprofits the last Wednesday of
 the month at <u>Open Shopping Day</u>.)
- All nonprofits can also order quantities of PPE items from Cincinnati ToolBank and arrange for pick-up at their 1682 E Seymour Ave. location. (Order at the Cincinnati ToolBank member order site or the non-member order site.) (Non-members will be asked to register their organization, but do not have to pay membership fees in order to obtain free PPE items.)

- Letter from employer
- Business card

This year, despite restrictions brought on by COVID-19, the Parks have succeeded in providing safe programing for the whole family. Parks @ Home is a new program that presents activities to engage children in nature from their own homes. Activities include indoor and outdoor options such as:

- Coloring pages of some local flora and fauna seen at the parks and in our own backyards including birds, insects, and other critters
- Nature journaling with prompts to engage in the wild world
- Backyard challenges with things to look for and activities to complete at home, like camping, fossil hunting, and scavenger hunts.

PPP, Payroll Forgiveness and DEI Informative Nonprofit Resources

PPP and Payroll Forgiveness Resources

Free resources are available to nonprofits to guide them through PPP and Payroll Forgiveness process:

Tech Soup recently presented a webinar titled "PPP Forgiveness and Payroll Forgiveness" to guide nonprofit leaders in preparing year-end W-2s and 1099s to comply with significant payroll cost reporting in Paycheck Protection Program loan forgiveness applications. Round Two of PPP Loans

Applications for a second round of Paycheck Protection Program loans are opening. Check with your bank for application information. The application is quite simple for agencies who have already received a previous PPP loan. Loans <u>do not</u> need to be forgiven prior to applying for a second round loan. <u>OneSource Center consultants</u> are available to guide agencies through the process if you are uncertain.
