Description: Grant writing can be quite daunting for newcomers and seasoned professionals alike! This interactive workshop will provide you with everything you need

to get started on your grant writing journey, and will feature a step-by-step guide to creating a proposal that meets your organization's needs.

Participants will learn the 12 critical elements that are necessary for successfully researching and writing each section of the grant proposal, and take part in quick, hands-on exercises to practice what they learn. "An Introduction to Grant Writing" will also include a number of key takeaways and resource materials that can be used to ensure continued success.

May marked the end of another successful year of leadership training for nonprofit CEOs and senior management through the NLIGC EXCEL program, and registrations are now open for the 2019-20 class.
