EXCEL is offered by the Nonprofit Leadership Institute of Cincinnati (NLIGC) as a nine-month leadership development and skills training program for nonprofit executive directors and high-level managers. EXCEL is designed to enrich the management capabilities of those individuals leading or preparing to lead nonprofit organizations in the Greater Cincinnati region.

OneSource Center embraces diversity, equity, and inclusion and recognizes the under-representation of people of color among the leadership in the nonprofit sector. 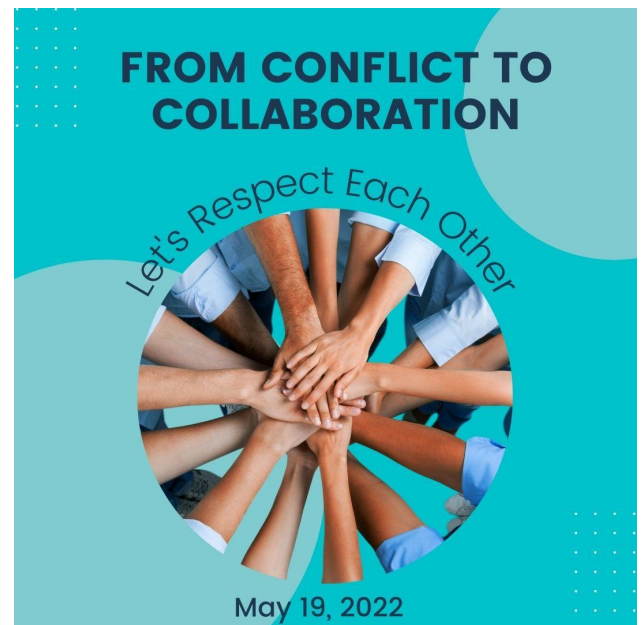
