Tim is a management and public finance specialist who devoted more than 35 years to public service with the express objective of making a difference. Prior to retirement, he was the City Manager for the City of Dayton. Tim promoted making Dayton an immigrant-friendly city as an essential part of the city's economic recovery plan. Tim's other positions in Dayton include serving as Dayton's Finance Director & OMB Director, and as the Deputy Executive Director of the Dayton International Airport. In Cincinnati, Tim was a mayoral appointee to the Banks Working Group charged with City's riverfront development. He is a former Deputy City Manager and Finance Director of Cincinnati, while also briefly serving as Acting Cincinnati City Manager. Tim's observations about effective governmental administration led him to write a seminal article, "Management by Unreasonable Objectives", about an award-winning management strategy which was subsequently published by the National League of Cities.

Tim's commitment to responsive government influences his ongoing activities. He is past president of the Government Finance Officers Association of the U.S. & Canada and former chairman of the Seasongood Good Governance Foundation. A former board member of the Cincinnati Southern Railway, he now is a consultant to the organization. While in Dayton, he commissioned a Monument to Public Service located in its downtown. He also is a strong advocate for creating King Records Museum in Cincinnati.
