

Assessing the Health of Your Nonprofit Free Nonprofit Checkups Give Insight

Did you know OneSource Center offers FREE Nonprofit Checkups, helping organizations assess the health of their nonprofit? The process is simple – usually involving the CEO and board chair providing some key information from materials they already have on hand. For most nonprofits who already have more to do than they can handle – this tool helps leaders prioritize where they should focus their efforts –

something that is often difficult when organization leaders are in the “thick of things.” Why does OneSource Center offer this complimentary service? The answer is simple: OneSource Center wants nonprofits to succeed!

[UpSpring](#), a nonprofit whose mission is to empower children experiencing homelessness in Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky through education and enrichment opportunities, took advantage of the free OneSource Center Nonprofit Checkup process after hearing about it at the Social Venture Partner “Fast Pitch” competition. The process sounded interesting to Executive Director Alex Kuhns and the price was right!



“The free Nonprofit Checkup process we went through with OneSource Center was a time for our organization to pause and quickly reflect on what we were doing well, and where we needed to make some adjustments,” said Kuhns. “As it turned out, some of the things our team was concerned about were things we could eliminate to better focus on things that had more impact. The process began some great conversations with our staff and board, and set the stage for a strategic planning initiative that ultimately helped us pivot easier with the pandemic response we are implementing now.”

The Nonprofit Checkup helps an organization look at what they are doing well and where there may be room for improvement. Nonprofit leaders and/or board members participate

in a couple short meetings with OneSource Center consultants to help define a clear understanding of the organization, and to reflect on programs and procedures already in place. More board members or staff can be involved in the process if the agency wants.

Andrew Jergens Foundation grant. The Foundation's prime interest is the health, education, cultural experiences and social welfare of children in the Greater Cincinnati area. Deadline for submission is Feb. 15, 2021.

The Spirit of Construction Foundation supports outreach initiatives that seek to engage young people in construction careers. Over the past 5 years (in addition to scholarship funding), the SOC Foundation has contributed over \$760,000 towards outreach and \$1.2 million since its founding. The initiatives have a construction component to them and are geared for the most part towards middle school and high school youth. Application deadline Feb. 15, 2021.


Butler Foundation grants. In keeping with its mission, the Foundation only funds public charities based in and/or serving Northern Kentucky residents. Priority goes to charities that provide basic, direct services to improve the long-term quality of life for our poor and disadvantaged neighbors. Typical Charity Grants include start-up funding, operating support, or program support for non-profits that provide shelter, food, clothing, education, legal representation, rehabilitation, therapy, substance abuse counseling, and/or child abuse prevention services for Northern Kentuckians in need. Application deadline: March 1, 2021.

Elsa Heisel Sule Foundation The Elsa Heisel Sule Foundation makes grants for programs serving the Greater Cincinnati and tri-state area with a focus on children, adults and animals in the following areas of interest: Education Success and Scholarships, Health, Wellness and Scientific Research, Children's Welfare and Competitive Sports, Fine and Performing Arts and Cultural Vibrancy, Civic Public Affairs, Animal Welfare and Preservation, Environmental and Community Stewardship LOI deadline: March 1, 2021.

Summertime Kids grants, available through the Greater Cincinnati Foundation with support from the Charles H. Dater Foundation are available to nonprofits, schools, or churches working with young people in GCF's eight-county community — Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren in Ohio; Boone, Campbell and Kenton in Kentucky; and Dearborn in Indiana. The funds may be used to support, expand or strengthen existing programs or launch new programs. Application deadline: March 1, 2021.




Discounted Bus Tickets Available
